Booking Form: Andy will meet with you at the church to fix a date and complete a **booking form** with you – and will then give you a copy as a “confirmation of booking.”

PLEASE NOTE: Reception venues are usually more difficult to book than the church, so you may want to investigate where your reception is to be **FIRST!**

Fees: There is no deposit to pay. We ask for total payment **by cash ONLY** three weeks before the wedding (or earlier if you wish!)

The Fees are below. The fees are set by the national church, and will go up a small amount each year.)

Wedding costs do vary year by year. Please contact us before you pay, to make sure that you know the **EXACT** cost of your wedding. Please pay by CASH.

Banns: by law, a church wedding has to be announced on three consecutive Sundays during the main Sunday service. **Banns are read on the first three Sundays of the month before your wedding.** For example, if you are getting married in July, the banns would be read on the first three Sundays in June. The precise dates when your banns are read will be on the form you complete with Andy. You do not have to be there when the banns are read, but it is nice if you can come on at least one of the three Sundays, or all three if you can. **You do NOT need to apply for a marriage licence if banns are read. If you DO need a licence (perhaps because you are not a British Citizen), the Vicar will help you get one!**

The Service

The service usually lasts between 20 and 45 minutes, depending on what you include in the way of readings, music and hymns.....

Holy Trinity is laid out in a circle, so you are surrounded by your guests. Christ Church has rows of pews, with the couple at the front.

The service follows the set Church of England format (the words for the vows and rings are printed below) but you can choose the following for yourself:

Music

You don't have to have an organist (although an organist will add a great deal to the atmosphere of your wedding) – you can use CD's of your choice, which you need to provide. You need entrance and exit music, music for the signing of the register, and – if you'd like them - one, two or three hymns. If you are having hymns, you'll need to have an organist. [SEE FURTHER ON FOR MUSIC AND HYMN SUGGESTIONS]. **Please note that the music can be traditional or modern! We can play CD's of any type of music you choose, including pop and rock songs!** **Why not meet with an organist to discuss music? You could catch them at a service on a Sunday – perhaps when you come to hear your banns read?**

Reading(s)/Poems

You can have a reading/poem or more than one reading/poem if you wish. There are lots of ideas further on! Perhaps (a) family member(s) or friend(s) (if used to speaking in public) might read for you!

Order of Service

Unless you are having a hymn or hymns, then a printed order of service for your wedding guests is not necessary, as they can just watch the wedding. But if you would like to have a printed order of service, then once you have told Andy what your choices of music are (and a reading/poem or two if you'd like a reading/poem) then Andy will produce for you a draft order of service. **We can then produce very simple, photocopied service orders for you, the cost of which is already covered in the fees you pay.** Or we can give you an outline order (by email or disk or memory stick) so you can produce your own or take it to a print shop to produce professionally.

Confetti/Photographs/ Filming

Confetti is fine, but if possible, WELL AWAY from the entrance door (so it doesn't blow back into the church)!

It is best to have one person filming or taking photos during the service, otherwise, photographs and filming are NOT allowed. We can allow opportunities for photos at the signing of the registers, and as the couple leave the church at the end.

Rehearsal

We will need to arrange, to take place at a mutually convenient time (day-time or evening) a 20/30 minute "walk-through" in the church, preferably within seven days of the wedding. It is handy, but not essential, if all those who are taking part can be there as well as the couple (bride's escort, best man, bridesmaids, readers, photographer.....plus any immediate family who'd like to come!) The priest will steer you through it all, and make it very easy (so you won't need to remember anything) but it will help you relax for the service!

Questionnaires:

Further on, are two copies of a sheet entitled "**What is important to you?**" If you want to do this exercise together, that's up to you.....no-one else see them! Many couples find it most interesting!

The last two pages has a questionnaire called "**Helping the priest get to know you**" (one for each of you!) Please complete it and return it to the priest some time!

And now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; and the greatest of these is love.

Ephesians 3.14-21

But you have kept the good wine until now.' Jesus did this, the first of his signs, in Cana of Galilee, and revealed his glory; and his disciples believed in him.
